



FOOD Share and Roadrunner Team Up for a Food Donation Campaign during the Holidays

Passengers are Encouraged to Bring Canned Goods for FOOD Share and Families in Need

CAMARILLO, Calif., Ft. Worth, TX (**Dec 5, 2018**) -- <u>FOOD Share</u> and <u>Roadrunner</u> announced today that they have teamed up to collect food for families in need during this holiday season. Starting Wednesday, December 5, 2018, through the end of January, Roadrunner will collect canned goods on their shuttle and car services. "We think this will be a great new and convenient way for people to contribute food during the holidays which is our busiest time of year and when we have the most need for food for people living in our region," said Monica White, President and CEO of FOOD Share, the region's food bank.

Earlier this year, Roadrunner was acquired by RATP Dev USA, a global leader in public transportation. Since the acquisition, a detailed focus has been placed on increasing operational efficiency and customer service - as evidenced by Roadrunner's new LAX Rideshare services. "Thousands of people ride a Roadrunner each day, whether headed to the airport, a private event or holiday party, reliable transportation is a must. We're happy to collect the canned food donations and make a matching cash contribution to the FOOD Share at the end of the campaign as part of We Move People, RATP Dev's community outreach program. "This is our way of saying thanks to the community as we continue Roadrunner's transportation leadership in the region," said Tom Witting, General Manager of Roadrunner. Roadrunner Drivers will collect the canned food and present FOOD Share with the total canned goods and Roadrunner's contribution. FOOD Share will distribute these charitable gifts to families in need of food and nutrition.

A Reception and Check Presentation will be held in late January at Monica White's home in the Ventura hills. Ms. White's home was damaged in the Thomas Fire in December of last year. "Our communities have gone through a lot in the last weeks and months," said Ms. White with reflection, adding, "we want to thank Roadrunner for remembering that many in our community have to worry about the bare necessities all of the time, including finding food to eat each day. This program should help fill our food pantries this season and we're thankful for that."

Over 40 years ago, eight citizens performed a good deed by distributing food to those who were in need underneath a Ventura bridge. The early philanthropic movement quickly formed into what is now Ventura County's regional food bank, FOOD Share, which has grown from serving a few hundred hungry people per month to 75,000 people. Today, staff and volunteers distribute nearly 12 million pounds of food, or nearly 10 million meals annually from its distribution sites; 180 partner agencies, which include neighborhood and church food distributions and soup kitchens; as well as hunger assistance programs. FOOD Share's programs provide healthy nutrition and education to children, families and seniors, which include: Kids' Farmers' Market, Senior Kits, Community Markets, and more. A 501(c) 3 non-profit

It's a great and easy way for them to get into the holiday spirit.

Q. Tom, what's your goal?

A. We want to collect food and thank the community we've served for over 20 years for their loyalty to Roadrunner. RATP Dev knows and values the commitment Roadrunner has made to this community -- providing convenient and safe transportation – as a part of our We Move People Community efforts we thought this would be a great way to give back. In addition to the canned goods, we will provide FOOD Share with a cash match of the value of each can of food donated.
